

From The Head Teacher's Desk

This week we celebrate the Virtues and Values
Of: GENEROSITY





Christ teaches us that we do not have to be rich, famous or even a pillar of society or the corner stone of the community to be generous -because generosity comes from the heart and not merely from the hands. The story of the Good Samaritan is timeless and teaches us such truths about the difference between doing good for show and being truly good at heart. Jesus used this story of The Good Samaritan to demonstrate that generosity of heart, mind and spirit on many occasions in our lives, comes from those we least expect to give it. In the story, a man was robbed, beaten up and left for dead by the way side. Along came a priestsomeone who should be generous and compassionate if not naturally by nature then, by virtue of his vocation and chosen profession. This priest, however, on seeing the wounded man crossed the street and walked by on the other side. He, like many of us, was perhaps afraid to come out of his comfort zone and get involved where an obvious crime had been committed. What would we have done? We should ask ourselves -in this era of killings and knife crimes, if we fell victim, who would we want to go passing by? Those who appear to be very nice people, but who would never risk getting involved even if it meant to save our life or those would always take the time to show compassion and mercy no matter what the cost? Are we generous of spirit? Many of us are very much like the priest in the story-we mean well.... but we often don't do well! Don't miss the message here- the priest in the story is a symbol of someone who is seen as being good by all, but is one who in actuality falls short of the generosity and compassion that God wants us to show to our 'neighbour' daily. Let us endeavour to become more like the Good Samaritan each day- humble, compassionate, caring, kind and generous of spirit.
